SAI celebrates 10 years of sustainability action

Leaders from across the sustainability sector came together in March to hold the SAI Platform's General Meeting and also a 10th anniversary luncheon event in Sydney hosted by the NSW Farm Writers, similar to the highly successful July 2017 breakfast event hosted by the Victorian Rural Press Club.

SAI President Jack Holden welcomed SAI members to the days' events which also featured an afternoon session for members of the recently-formed SAI Supporters Group. SAI Platform has been successful at bringing together people and groups with an interest in sustainable agricultural production to share knowledge and best practices. The new Supporters Group is aimed at members of civil society groups, government organisations and universities engaged in sustainable agriculture initiatives.

The SAI meeting for members provided an opportunity to share experiences in enhancing sustainability and develop collaborative projects. The session that included supporters featured a mini-forum on economic sustainability, including a briefing on on an exciting project about finance sector recognition of sustainability initiatives by graziers, and an update on developments in genetic technologies.

The NSW Farm Writers event featured presentations by SAI members from across the agriculture, food and fishing supply chain on the sustainability challenges they have faced and how they have addressed those challenges. Nearly 80 attendees from the media, finance and many other sectors heard first-hand about these real-world experiences.

A 'living' case study on sustainable value generation - a SAI collaborative project



SAI Platform Australia has been undertaking a collaborative project documenting for SAI members in 'real time' the evolution of an initiative by our member Tassal Ltd to demonstrate the shared value generated by its aquaculture operations and associated value chain activities in the various communities in which it operates. The case study is a 'living' document given the ongoing evolution of Tassal's approach to demonstrating shared value and the continuing investments made by the company around Tasmania.

More SAI collaborative projects underway

SAI Platform Australia members are collaborating on a number of projects as part of the Platform's plan for 2018. These include an investigation into economic sustainability including a review of its meaning, and learning about one of our members' initiative to secure financial market recognition for farmers' sustainability initiatives; a project on food security and one on nutrition and sustainability.
