SAI Members and Supporters meet to tackle sustainability challenges

SAI Platform Australia Members and Supporters met in Melbourne at the Melbourne Business School in November to advance their understanding of sustainability challenges and improve their ability to tackle those challenges.

The meeting featured a Forum with the University of Melbourne Faculty of Veterinary and Agricultural Sciences and the Melbourne Business School (see photos above and item below). The meeting included the Annual General Meeting of the Platform - congratulations to the following Office Bearers and Committee who were elected:

Sustainable Business Forum

The Platform held a Sustainable Business Forum with University of Melbourne Faculty of Veterinary and Agricultural Sciences and Melbourne Business School at the Melbourne Business School 200 Leicester Street, Carlton.

Around 40 guests were invited to take their seats by Julia Seddon from SAI Platform and Inghams who welcomed everyone and introduced the Forum, the theme being: The unique role of business in addressing sustainable agriculture challenges into the future. Julia spoke about what SAI Platform is all about: collaboration, learning and projects across the supply chain, and introduced the speakers.

Professor Richard Eckard, Faculty of Veterinary and Agricultural Sciences, University of Melbourne; Director, Primary Industries Climate Challenges Centre spoke about the key scientific issues for sustainable agriculture production systems, and the roles of sustainable intensification under climate change.

A copy of Richard's comprehensive presentation will be available in the members only area of the Platform website.

Jack Holden, SAI Platform and Fonterra presented on Fonterra's initiatives in addressing sustainability challenges and bringing about change, focussing on incentives for farmer suppliers introduced by Fonterra to encourage change, and the new Unilever ice-cream being promoted as using sustainable cream.

Assoc. Prof Vivek Chaurhri, Academic Director, Executive MBA Programs, Melbourne Business School provided a thought-provoking talk on strategic approach to sustainability in business and what needs to be done in future, focussing on the role played by technology, markets, governments in developing sustainable solutions.

Assoc. Prof Gregory Harper, Business Development Director, Faculty of Veterinary and Agricultural Sciences, University of Melbourne thanked everyone and overviewed the event.

It was agreed following the event that the Platform would engage with the University and the Business School in developing collaborative project initiatives.

A video recording was made of the Forum and this will be available soon.

Members leading the way



SAI Collaborative Projects Underway

SAI Platform Australia members have collaborating on a number of projects as part of the Platform's Plan for 2018 and more are planned for 2019.

One of these is an investigation into economic sustainability which is focusing on the concept of eco-system services. In many countries, there are agri-environmental (or ecosystem) services programs that use public funds to pay for the external public impacts generated by agriculture. These are not subsidies like payments that support farmers incomes through higher prices for farm products. While the farmer gets paid for these services the whole supply chain beyond the farm gate benefits from the positive externalities generated (or negative externalities avoided). The Platform has advancing understanding of this concept through the networks of its members. Watch out for further developments in this space.

Another project concerns nutrition and sustainability. Sustainability is increasingly being incorporated into nutritional Guidelines with major implications for food producers. Our next General Meeting will focus on this development and its potential impact on our members with an invited expert's presentation and analysis.

Other projects include: compliance with modern slavery legislation; recognition of farmers' sustainability initiatives by finance service providers; and consistency of the SAI Platform Guidelines on sustainable supply chains with the UN Sustainable Development Goals.



Members and Supporters Sustainability Initiatives

Our member **Mars Petcare's** sustainable wheat initiative offers drought-stricken farmers new insights. Record-breaking is one word to describe the current drought in Australia. Last September was the driest on record For farmers in the state of New South Wales, the wheat crop is forecast to produce less than a third of the average annual yield. It's the toughest cropping season for many years. It was against this backdrop that Mars Petcare accepted the invitation to present its Australian Cool Farm Initiative at the Riverine Plains open day in September. Riverine Plains is a farmer association in north-east Victoria and southern New South Wales, Australia. Around 90 farmers attended the open day, held on a farm in Victoria that's home to test plots for productivity improvement.

Juliette Caulkins, Mars Petcare Global Senior Sustainable Sourcing Manager, and Cassie Scheffe, Cool Farm Initiative Soil Scientist, presented the project. "We explained how the initiative can help wheat farmers improve farm soil health through better data," says Juliette. "Healthier soil increases productivity and crop resilience. But it also captures carbon, which lowers greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. Together with Sarah Heazlewood, Mars Petcare APAC Grains Sourcing Manager, Juliette and Cassie spoke with farmers. They discussed farming challenges and how the Cool Farm Initiative can help. Next, Cassie will visit interested farms to showcase the project. "Last year, we successfully completed a project demonstration pilot. Now it's time to get more farmers involved. That's why we attended the open day," summarizes Juliette. "Farmers are pleased to see companies acknowledging their difficulties. Mars stands out because the Cool Farm Initiative benefits farmers with better scientific farm data as well as helping the company achieve its Sustainable in a Generation targets.
